COMMERCE-TRADE

STRAWBERRIES GONE AND NEW POTATOES ARRIVED.

Green Cucumbers are Here—Eggs Have Advanced and New Potatoes Lost Three Cents Per Pound—General Market is Slow and Almost Without Variety or Fluctuation.

Strawberry shortcake is now nothing but the memory of a pleasant dream, for the berries have gone out of the market and the lover of the product will have to turn to the pantry which the provident housewife has filled in the weeks now past. Now and then some belated farmer comes in to the dealer with a box or two, but the harvest is over and the berry is gone.

Other things have gone, some entirely and some up. Parsnips have gone out of the market, and old potatoes have almost disappeared. But the latter place is filled by new potatoes that have been in the market for the last week or two. These are fine in quality and are quoted at 2 cents per pound.

Cucumbers have also made their appearance, and the cholera infantum ghost is abroad in the land. Everything else is about as it was a week ago.

Local Hide Market.

The Wheat Trade.
Portland, July 9.—Very little doing in the local wheat markets. Stocks of unsold wheat are very small and those holders that have any for sale are not in the market. Crop advices from Oregon are in the state with harvest about 80 per cent of that of last year, and from Washington they will not have over 70 per cent. There is an increased acreage throughout the Northwest, but not sufficient to make a great difference in the total yield, especially as much of the grain will not produce a big crop the first year. The quality of the wheat, providing conditions prove favorable, from now on harvest should be very good. The grain section along the Idaho line has received a great deal more rain than other wheat districts on the east slope of the Cascades. Quotations remain nominal, with club at 76c, bluestem 78c and 79c and valley 76c per bushel.

Flour—There is nothing new in this market. The demand for flour continues good and China is without change, as stocks are being worked off slowly there. A reaction in the local market at Portland leading flour to South Africa, and some shipments are going down by steamer to California. This, with the usual Oriental shipments, makes up the total of outward business at present. Quotations range from \$3.45 to \$4.35 per barrel.

Millstuffs—No change as the demand or supplies can be noted. Quotations rule firm at \$22.50 per ton for bran or shorts, middlings at \$26.50 per ton.

Barley—Stocks being very small, there is nothing doing. The prospects for a large crop are very good. In the meantime, small parcels remain on hand are being used by the local cash mills and prices are stationary at \$20 per ton for feed.

San Francisco Market.
San Francisco, July 9.—Wheat market has been rather quiet, as the exchanges all took a long holiday and there is nothing doing in the local cash market at present. Great interest is manifested, from the reports of the various sections of the state, in regard to the outlook for the harvest. In some sections the returns show better than anticipated at first and in others great disappointment is manifested. The outlook is not very favorable for a crop as good as the previous one, and conservative prices in the trade look for a decrease of 15 per cent. Quotations for new crop wheat range \$1.30 to \$1.32 1/2 per cent, and milling \$1.37 1/2 to \$1.40 per cent.

Boston, July 9.—The wool market had a decidedly better feeling this week, which has a very substantial basis in the bettering and activity manifested. Prices were gradually stiffening, but as yet there is not much advance actually registered. Territory wool is the list of sales. New fine wools are quotable at 52 1/2 to 53c, with fine medium at 48 to 50c, and medium at 46 to 48c.
