PEACHES COMING INTO THE CITY FROM ALL QUARTERS.

Retailing at 5 Cents Per Pound at Stores, and 45 to 65 Cents per Box - Beech Has Only Fallen 10 Cents a Hundred - Many Stockmen Will Hold Over Before Selling at Low Prices.

The principal thing of interest in the market this week is the flood of peaches that is coming into the city from the Milton country, and to a lesser degree from the Walla Walla and Wallula orchards.

Peaches are selling at 5 cents a pound retail or from 45 to 65 cents a box. The fruit is of good quality, large and will rank with the same variety for other places that comes in to the country at any time of the year.

Outside of the fruit and grocery line there is not much of interest, though the prices of cattle have fallen to a certain extent. Some time ago it was reported that the prices at which young steers were selling had dropped from \$3.50 to \$2.25 at the bottom quotations and while this may be so, it has not been as yet borne out in practice for the least that has been accepted in the last week is \$3.40, a drop of 10 cents.

The meat market has fallen in part and the buyers are wanting it to fall more, though no other hand, the growers are hoping that they will be able to unload their surplus without damaging the quotations to a greater extent than has already been done.

RAINS EVERYWHERE

STOCK IN GOOD SHAPE

The first five days of the week were warm and pleasant and excellent for harvesting wheat and hops. On Saturday the weather became showery and unsettled, and light rains occurred in all parts of the state.

These rains were of great benefit to pastures and late potatoes, but they interfered with the harvest of spring wheat, and also caused an increase of vermin in the hop yards.

Spring wheat harvest is drawing to a close and threshing is progressing rapidly. The grain yields continue satisfactory, and the reports from nearly everywhere are that the quality is above average.

Clarno, Wheeler county, L. H. Hale - Cool nights, warm days, and light rain; potatoes are good; apples not a heavy crop; pears good; peaches not very plentiful; stock is looking well considering the range.

La Grande, Union county, W. F. Gekeler - Weather very warm, but cool wind and cloudy Saturday; wheat well along; some fields yield well and others are rather poor; nearly all wheat is of good quality.

Burns, Harney county, Mel Penwick - Weather very favorable for harvesting; not enough grain threshed yet to estimate yield; potatoes are doing finely.
