ABSORB IV. & C. R.

NORTHERN PACIFIC WILL TAKE OVER BRANCH LINES. President Elliott of the Northern Pacific Announces that all Feeders Will Be Absorbed by Parent System.

Walla Walla, Oct. 21.—The interesting information comes from Spokane that President of the Northern Pacific will inaugurate a new system soon by which a number of branch lines, which have been heretofore controlled by auxiliary corporations are to be taken over and controlled by the parent company with headquarters in St. Paul.

The Washington Railway & Navigation Company, which has controlled the Portland, Vancouver & Yakima and the Washington & Oregon lines, is announced to be taken over by the main corporation and the lines are to be made a part of the main lines.

The Hunt system, known as the Washington & Columbia River railroad, has been run by the Northern Pacific for several years, but not as a part of the general system. The Northern Pacific, it is said, owned the stock of the road, but not the bonds. Now report states that it has secured about \$3,000,000 of the bonds from C. B. Wright & Co., and is expected to put the line in as a part of the general system.

The Northwestern Improvement Company, an auxiliary corporation to the Northern Pacific, which owns the Rosalia coal mines, and whose headquarters were removed to Tacoma some time ago, will, it is said, move its headquarters again soon, probably back to Rosalia, thus handing the offices nearer to the seat of operations.
