The value of manufactured products in the state of Oregon increased from \$46,000,587 in 1900, to \$83,937,-000 in 1903. The value of manufacturing plants in the state at the close of 1903 is \$43,000,000 and the value of those in Portland is \$32,000,000. The output of timber products, aside from lumber, such as logs, poles, piling, ties, cordwood, hardwood and all other timber sold in the rough, leads the list of industries, with an astonishing value of \$30,000,000 for the year. The lumber sales alone, amounted to \$18,000,000 in addition to the above. The flouring and grist mill products follow in third place with a value of \$8,000,000 for 1903, meat packing and slaughtering next, with a value of \$5,000,000, and the fish cannery industry comes in fifth place with \$2,500,000. There are 4,500 manufacturing establishments in the state, 2,000 of which are in Portland.
