OUTLINE OF THE WATER DISPUTES NEAR MILTON.

Walla Walla River is a Freak-Union of Two Streams it Divides and Forms Two Streams—History of the Water Division and Settlement Along the Streams. The contention over the division of the water of the Tum-alum and the Little Walla rivers, and the formation of the first irrigation district in the state on the Little Walla, taken all together, forms an interesting story.

Converge Near the Columbia. After sweeping northward and southward for 10 or 12 miles, these two streams converge at a point near the Columbia in a decision fixed the point of division for the two streams and decreed that each, the Tum-alum and the Little Walla, should be apportioned one-half of the natural flow of water coming down the main Walla Walla river, forever after.
