WHEAT IS HIGHER IN ALL THE MARKETS.

Raise of Three Cents in New York—Activity Felt in All the Great Markets—War is Making its Fervent Felt in the Pits of All the Leading Shipping Centers.

Chicago, Feb. 25.—All markets are higher today.

Armour's operations and the unsettled condition of the European market, continued, but the high cables from the continent were the principal cause of the advances here.

May options in wheat opened at \$1.05, an advance of 1c from the close of yesterday.

Old July opened at 94 1/2c, was 97c as the top and 94 1/2c as the low.

New York opened at 93 1/2c and later climbed to 96 1/2c as the highest price of the day.

Active buying of corn caused advances in all options.

SOME PHASES OF THE WOOL MARKET

SOMEWHAT UNPROMISING PROSPECT IN SOME WAYS.

Very Small Margin in Sight for the Middleman—Profit Possible Only Unless the General Market Advances or the Price Falls—Chances for the War Effecting an Advance in Wool Are Considered Nebulous—Increase in Size of Clip.

Jacob Scheurman, who last year bought wool for the Pendleton mills, has not yet decided whether or not he will buy for the same people this year, or whether he will act independently.

Very Narrow Margin. The wool bought here and shipped to the east coast for Mr. Scheurman is now selling at 10c, and out of this has to come the interest on the investment, storage and other charges, so that the margin is very small.

POISONING ALLEGED

CLAIMED RAILROADER'S WIFE DOCTORED HIS TEA.

End of the First Week of Married Felicity for Mr. Legg and His Wife of Pleasant Valley—The Tea Killed a Dog and Made Mr. Legg Sick, and He at Once Concluded Something Was Wrong.

The East Oregonian is in receipt of the telegram printed below, giving details of an alleged attempt at husband poisoning near Baker City:

Pleasant Valley, Feb. 25.—(Special to the East Oregonian.)—Mrs. L. M. Legg tried to poison her husband, a fireman on the O. R. & N., last night at the supper table, by giving him doctored tea.

Last night about 6:15 o'clock, Mr. Legg went out on some errand, and when he came back to the house, supper was ready. He sat down, tasted his tea and complained. Mrs. Legg that it did not taste right. She then put two spoonfuls of sugar in it, but he objected to so much sugar, and becoming suspicious, poured some out into a saucer, and putting some milk with it, fed it to a little dog. It killed the dog in about three minutes.

Legg turned and looked at his wife and asked her if she intended the tea for him. She took the balance of the tea, making believe she was going to drink it, but threw it out.

Legg's taste of the tea began to affect him, and by the time he got outside his wife fainted, and he called to a passerby who helped him move her into the house. A doctor was sent for. He arrived on the midnight train, but it is understood he failed to find the woman was poisoned. Both are up and around today, but no action has been taken, and the public is in the dark as to what will be done.

Legg is a fireman on the O. R. & N., and is about 50 years of age. His wife is 21, and was, before her marriage, Miss Lillie Schaefer. They were married in Pleasant Valley on February 18.
