MAKE THE LAW RIGHT.

That was an awful scare over prohibition in Umatilla county, and it served a good purpose, because it made the violators of the law feel in a way they never felt before, the power of the people.

It was a close shave and will be the means of placing the liquor business where it belongs, in the absolute power of every community, for its disposal as it sees fit, and as public sentiment in that community directs.

The thing for all classes of people to do now, is to make that local option law right before the people—make it what people were led to believe it was last spring—a purely precinct law.

The law should not be repealed. It will not be repealed, but it should be framed to so govern the liquor business that it will be more self-respecting, more liberal in its treatment of the opposition, which has a right to exist in the community, and which has a right to select the surroundings of every community, if the opposition is in the majority.

As a rebuke to the scheme of the radicals, who hid a big wolf in a sheep's pelt, in this local option law, many formerly dry precincts have gone wet, rather than endorse this sumptuary measure, in its present extreme radicalism.

The East Oregonian had little fear of county prohibition carrying, and said so a week ago, but it does say, as it said last spring, that each community should have full control of this matter, full and final judgment as to the environment that surrounds it.

To this end, this paper will lend its aid to every effort to amend the local option law as now in force, in this state, to confine it to precincts, exclusively. That was the ostensible object of the present law, but it was dishonestly manipulated by men who should have loved the cause better than to so besmirch it, and now the legislature must modify it to conform to public sentiment.

In this effort, all classes of law-respecting citizens will join, and the recent scare, which has had the effect of partially demoralizing business, will not visit the state again.

DEMOCRATIC HOPES.

From the overwhelming and bewildering profusion of republican votes just cast for a president, it would seem that a strong imagination—almost an X-ray in its penetration—is necessary to see any democratic hope for the future, unless democratic statesmen place democracy on a plane that will more readily appeal to the people.

That democracy is founded upon certain fundamental principles of government, which will not perish nor decay as long as free government exists, is admitted. But democracy is nothing, if it is not flexible—if it can't adjust itself to the changing needs of the people.

Because Thomas Jefferson laid down a beautiful and simple code of government 160 years ago, is no reason that democrats of today should go down to defeat continually in trying to enforce that same old code in the 20th century.

The underlying principles are yet alive and pregnant with meaning, but they must be adjusted to the economic demands of 60,000,000 people, expanded territory and multiplied commercial interests.

Now that election is over and the government officials and members of cabinet are released from the arduous duties of the campaign, it is hoped the postoffice frauds will be taken up again. INDIAN LAND TO OPEN.

A special from Tekoa to the Oregon Sunday Journal, says: "It is altogether probable that within the near future the Cour d'Alene Indian reservation, just northeast of Tekoa, will be opened for settlement. Congressman Burton L. French of Idaho spent a night in Tekoa this week. He was on his way to Harrison and Northern Idaho points, where he is billed to make some campaign speeches. Several citizens of Tekoa took advantage of his presence in the city to have a talk on the possible opening of the Cour d'Alene Indian reservation. Congressman French gave it as his opinion that the next session of congress would pass the bill throwing open the reserve to homestead entries. According to his views this is sure to be done, provided the surveys are completed before congress convenes.

"This for the survey are now being let by the surveyor general and if they are completed in time there is a chance that the reserve will be opened next year. If not, another year will elapse before the opening can take place. He spoke unreservedly to the committee and felt confident that the bill would pass.

"The opening of this reserve and allotments like its predecessors means much to Tekoa. Farmington and Rockford and to Northern Idaho. It will give to these towns greater and more rapid growth and prestige.
