The school directors of Wallula have assessed a tax of 6 mills on the dollar—2 mills to pay the teachers, and 4 mills to build a new school-house.

There are 85 pupils in attendance at the public school at Minniewille. Port Townsend district paid \$1,675 teachers' salaries in one school during the last year.

Seven thousand six hundred sacks of wheat were shipped from Dayton in one day last week. Six thousand shares of the Esther Mining Company were sold in Roseburg on Wednesday last.

The late heavy rains have raised the river emptying into the Sound out of their banks in many places. The Oregon City Brewery manufactured 1,135 barrels of malt liquor for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1876.

Mr. James Pender, editor of the Ballinghams Bay Mail, has received the appointment of Inspector of Customs at Whatcom.

The "Fannie Patton," the first boat of the season, to the great delight of the people of Lafayette woke the echoes about this village with her shrill and welcome whistle on Tuesday of last week.

Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Arizona and New Mexico together, are turning out each day \$30,000 in gold, \$17,000 in silver, and \$1,500 in base metal, giving a total of \$38,500 each day, or \$11,550,000 annually.

The Salem City Council have instructed the committee on ordinances to report an ordinance making certain city officers salaried ones, fixing the compensation of the marshal, \$1,000; recorder, \$800; and treasurer, \$300.
