



OREGON'S NEW GAME LAWS.

Senate bill No. 213 which passed last session of the legislature and is now a law, embraces practically all the legal restriction surrounding the hunter and fisherman's amusement. Following is a synopsis of every section, except such portion as relates to the duties of the fish

Elk, moose or mountain sheep cannot be hunted or killed from December 1st to August 1st and must not be killed at The great Walace shows exhibit here anytime for skins, hides, horrs, etc.

Spotted fawn must not be killed at any time. Deer must not be killed from Decem-
