Now They Know It.

New York, Aug. 13.—At Madison Square Garden last night William J. Bryan, of Nebraska, and Arthur Sewall, of Maine were formally notified of their nominations, by the democratic party, for the offices of president and vice-president respectively of the United States.

The ceremony was witnessed by an immense concourse of people, who packed the vast hall from pit to dome while additional thousands, who could not gain entrance to the structure, crowded the adjoining streets and buildings in the hope of catching a glimpse of the so-called boy orator, upon his exit from the building.

The official speech of notification was delivered by Governor Stone of Missouri, and was a lengthy recapitulation and attempted justification of the financial declarations drafted by the democrats in their Chicago platform, supplemented by a comparatively brief but glowing tribute to the party's candidate, Mr. Bryan.

The official letter of notification from Senator White of California, was then handed to Bryan, after which the Nebraska name came to the front of the platform and began to speak.

His speech was a decided departure from the fiery oratorical effort which he made at Chicago during the convention which gave him the democratic nomination for president. Then he swayed the multitudes by arousing them to a high pitch of enthusiasm, now he adopted a style of speech, which was rather argumentative than oratorical, and which clearly showed that his speech had been edited and changed from its original style by the comparatively cool-headed and sagacious democratic managers, that it might not give offense and cost their candidate more votes than it gained for him.

Bryan discussed the financial question to the almost total exclusion from his speech of all other subjects, taking up its various points one by one and dealing with them from a free-silver standpoint.

After Bryan's address was finished Sewall came forward and made a brief speech and was heartily cheered by the crowd. The meeting then adjourned.
