A Sad Accident.

An accident during the field sports Monday we chronicle with profound regret and unfeigned sorrow; an accident by which one of our esteemed citizens came near losing his life; viz. the striking of Mr. H. Parry on the head by a 16 pound cannon ball thrown by Mr. O. G. Hughson. During the contest the mass of eager spectators kept crowding up by office. an intense desire to witness this feat of strength by the contestants, leaving but a narrow opening for the shot as it flew from the athlete's hand. But in this preseing forward of the bystanders, amongst them was Mr. Parry, brought a portion of the crowd in line with the shot which, at the time we speak of, flew a little farther to the left than usual into the mass of men and boys composing it, and when the missile flew into the crowd there was a scampering and dodging to escape it, but so dense and packed was the crowd behind Mr. Perry that he was unable to escape the shot, which struck him on the right side of the head a sort of glancing blow, cutting his scalp open several inches, knocking him senseless, and prostrating him like an ox shot in the head with a

rifle ball. He remained in an unconscious state for several minutes and great fears were entertained for a while that he had received a fatal blow.
