1872-73 Chapter CXXXI. An act revising and amending the laws relative to the mints, assay offices and coinage of the United States.

Sec, 13. That the standard for both gold and silver coins of the United States shall be such that of 1000 parts by weight 900 shall be of pure metal and 100 of alloy; and the alloy of the silver coins shall be of copper and the alloy of the gold coins shall be of copper, or of copper and silver; but the silver shall in no case exceed one-tenth of the whole

Sec. 14. That the gold coins of the United States shall be a \$1 piece, which, at the standard weight of 25.8 grains shall be the unit of value; a quarterengle, or \$2.50 piece; a \$3 piece; a halfeagle, or \$5 piece; an eagle, or \$10 piece, and a double eagle, or \$20 piece. And the standard weight of the gold dollar shall be 25.8 grains; of the quarter-eagle, or \$2.50 piece, 64% grains; of the \$3 piece, 74.4 grains; of the half-eagle, or \$5 piece, 129 grains; of the eagle, or \$10 piece, 258 grains; of the double eagle, or \$20 piece, 516 grains, which coins shall be a legal tender in all payments, at their nominal value, when not below the standard weight and limit of tolerance provided in this act for the single piece, and when reduced in weight, below said standard and tolerance, shall be a 1-gal tender at a valuation in proportion to their actual weight; and any gold coin the standard weight prescribed by per acre. law after a circulation of 20 years, age, and at a ratable proportion terms. for any period less than 20 years, shall be received at their nominal value by protection of the government against fraudulent abrasion or other practices; and any gold coins in the treasury of the United States reduced in weight below Estate Office, or on this limit of ale a don shall be recoiped. Sec. 15. That the silver coins of the

United States shall be a trade dollar, a half-dollar, or 50-cent piece; a quarterdollar, or 25-cent piece, a dime or 10-cent piece, and the weight of the trade dollar shall be 420 grains troy; the weight of the half-dollar shall be 1212 grams; the quarter-dollar and the dime shall be, the weight of said half-dollar; and said coins shall be a legal tender at their nominal value for any amount not exceeding \$5 in any one payment.

Sec. 17. That no coins, either of gold, silver, or minor coinage shall hereafter be issued from the mint other than those of the denominations, standards and weights herein set forth.

The standard silver dollar was omitted from the list given in section 15. It was claimed that this was done by fraud. This was the so-called crime of 1873.

Sec. 21. That any owner of silver bullion may deposit the same at any mint, to be formed into bars or into dollars of the weight of 420 grains, troy, designated in this act as trade dollars; and no deposit of silver for other coinere. shall be received; but silver bullion contained in gold deposits, and separated therefrom, may be paid for in ailver coin, at such valuation as may be, from time to time, established by the director of the mint. Sec. 25 That the charge for convert-

ing standard gold bullion into coin shall be one-fifth of 1 percentum; and the charges for converting standard silver into trade dollars, for melting and refining when builion is below standard, for toughening when metals are contained in it which render it untit for coinage, for copper used for alloy when the bullion is above standard, for separating the gold and silver when there metals exist together in the bullion, and for the preparation of bars, shall be fixed from time to time by the director, with the concurrence of the secretary of the freazury, so as to equal but not exceed, in their judgement, the actual average cost to each mint, and essay office of the material, labor wastage and use of machinery employed in each of the cases aforementioned.


