THE LAW OF 1890.

The Sherman Act and the Purchase of Silver Bullion.

1889-90. Chapter DCCVIII. An act directing the purchase of silver bullion and the i-sue of treasury notes thereon, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted. That the secretary of the treasury is hereby directed to purchase, from time to time, silver bullion to the aggregate amount of 4,500,000 price thereof, not exceeding \$1 for 371 per acre. 25-160 grains of pure silver, and to issue in payment for such purchase of silver States, to be prepared by the secretary terms. of the treasury, in such form and of such denominations, not less than \$1, nor propriated out of any money in the tunity. treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Sec. 2. That the treasury notes issued in accordance with the provisions of this Estate Office, or on act shall be redeemable on demand, in coin, at the treasury of the United States, and when so redeemed may be reissued, but no greater or less amount of such notes shall be outstanding at any time than the cost of the silver bullion and the standard silver dollars coined therefrom then held in the treasury purchased by such notes; and such treasury notes shall be a legal tender in payment of all debts, public and private, except where otherwise expressly stipulated in the contract, and shall be receivable for customs, ceived may be reissued; and such notes. when held by any national banking association, may be counted as a part of its legal reserve. Sec. 3. That the secretary of the treasury shall each month coin 2,000,000 ounces of the silver bullion purchased under the provisions of this act into standard silver dollars, until the 1st day of July, 1891, and after that time he shall coin of the silver bullion purchased under the provisions of this act as may be necessary to provide for the redemption of the treasury notes herein provided for, and any gain or seigniorage arising from such coinage shall be accounted for and paid into the freasury.

Sec. 4. That the silver bullion purchased under the provisions of this act shall be subject to the requirements of existing law and the regulations of the mint service governing the methods of determining the amount of pure silver contained, and the amount of charges and deductions, if any, to be made,


Sec. 5. That so much of the act of February 28, 1878, entitled, "An act to authorize the coinage of the standard silver dollar and to restore its legal tender character," as requires the monthly purchase and coinage of the same into silver dollars of not less than \$2,000,000 nor more than \$4,000,000 worth of silver bullion, is hereby repealed.

Sec. 6, That upon the passage of this act the balances standing with the treasury of the United States to the respective credits of national banks for deposits made to redeen the circulating notes of such banks, and all deposits thereafter received for like purpose, shall be covered into the treasury as a miscellaneous receipt, and the treasurer of the United States shall redeem from the general cash in the tressury the circulating notes of said banks, which may come into his possession, subject to redemption, and upon the certificate of the controller of the currency that such notes have been received by him, and that they have been destroyed, and that no new notes will be issued in their place, reimburrements of their amount shall be made to the

tressurer, under such regulations as the secretary of the treasury may prescribe, from an appropriation bereby created, to be known as "Na ional bank notes; redemption account." but the ovisions of this act shall not apply to the deposits received under section 3 of the act of June 20, 1874, requiring every national bank to keep in lawful money with the treasurer of the United States a sam equal to 5 percentum of its circulation, to be held and used for the redemption of its circulating notes; and the balance remaining of the deposits so covered shall, at the close of each month, be reported on the monthly public debt statement as debt of the United States bearing no interest.

7. That this act shall take effect 30 days from and after its passage.


