"The standard silver dollars issued act of 1878, now amounting to more than \$433,000,000, have been coined on public account from bullion purchased by the government, and are legal tender in payment of all debts, public and private, without regard to the amount, except when otherwise stipulated expressly in the contracts between the parties.
