A SILVER MINE OWNER

Declares that Silver Cannot be Made Worth \$1.20 Per Ounce.

Henry Kippenberg of Montana, presidential elector on the republican ticket, in his letter of acceptance says:

In my opinion it would be worth millions of good money to Montana if the state should cast its electoral vote for McKinley and Hobart and send Goddard to congress. To stand by national honor and patriotic duty is to sow the seed that springs up and bears an hundred fold, and brings gladness to every honest man, woman and child.

Never had Montana such an opportunity as the present time to raise the credit of her people; that all states should respect her in years to come. Under the conditions which now prevail in the commercial world the silver enthusiast loses sight of one very important elementary principle, namely, that values cannot be created by legislation. My silver, today, is worth 55 cents per ounce, and it is the height of absurdity to say that should the congress of the United States pass a bill, and the president affix his signature to it, the same silver would be worth \$1.20. These commercial values are fixed, not by legislation, but by the laws of trade, which are world wide in application, and as inexorable and immutable as the laws of gravitation. Just as well might we expect, in this country, to establish by legislation a new law of gravitation, as to say that by legislation we could make silver worth more than the commercial world says it is worth. The monetary system is universal and is fixed by the laws of trade and commerce. There is no such thing as a national monetary system. There is no such thing as a national law of trade and commerce. Supply and demand is universal.

Protection is national and can be determined, absolutely, by national legislation. The American congress can do nothing for my silver, but it can open the mills and the factories of the country by protection. Believing, firmly, that the national republican party in this great political contest is right, I have confidence in the honesty of the American people that leads me to believe that victory will be ours on November 3rd.

EIGHT PRESIDENTIAL TICKETS.

Pay Your Money and Take Your Choice.

There are eight presidential tickets so far in the field. Here they are:

1. Prohibition party national ticket, nominated at Pittsburgh, May 27—For president, Joshua Leysing, of Maryland; for vice president, Hale Johnson, of Illinois.

2. National party national ticket, nominated at Pittsburgh, May 28, by seceding "broad gauge" or free silver prohibitionists—For president, Rev. Chas. E. Beatty, of Nebraska; for vice-president, James Hayward, of South Carolina.

3. Republican party national ticket, nominated at St. Louis, June 18—For president, William McKinley, of Ohio; for vice president, Garrett Augustus Hobart, of New Jersey.

4. Socialist-Labor party national ticket nominated in New York city, July 4—For president, Chas. H. Matchett, of New York; for vice president, Matthew Maguire, of New Jersey.

5. Democratic national ticket, nominated at Chicago, July 10—For president, William Jennings Bryan, of Nebraska; for vice president, Arthur Sewall, of Maine.

6. Populist party national ticket, nominated at St. Louis, July 26—For president, William Jennings Bryan, of Nebraska; for vice president, Thomas E. Watson, of Georgia.

7. American silver party national ticket, endorsed at St. Louis, July 26—For president, William Jennings Bryan, of Nebraska; for vice president, Arthur Sewall, of Maine.

8. Indianapolis "National Democratic" ticket, nominated at Indianapolis, September 3—For president, John McAuley Palmer, of Illinois; for vice president, Simon Bliver Beckner, of Kentucky.

The election in Florida came off last Tuesday. The vote shows a heavy falling off of the democratic vote. The vote so far as canvassed gives Bloxham, democrat, for governor, 10,000 majority over Gunby, republican, and has probably a plurality of 25,000 votes. By this vote the amendment to the state constitution abolishing the October elections, was ratified.
