

TERRIBLE WINTER AHEAD.

Astor, the astrologer, in the Statesman, forecasts as follows:

Where is General Weyler?

HAVANA, Cuba, Nov. 14.—As the days pass and bring no news from the Spanish forces in the province of Pinar del Rio the anxiety grows deeper and more rumors are circulated.

The situation of General Weyler is unknown, and the non-receipt of intelligence concerning his movements leads many to believe that he is in the hands of the rebels. It is reported that the rebel chief Dacassi was killed in the engagement with General Weyler's forces in the Real hills.

Colonel Lara reports having an engagement with a party of rebels near Calabazar, province of Santa Clara. He says the insurgents were routed with a loss of twenty-one killed. The troops lost three killed and seven wounded.

Serain Santiago, a rebel leader, attacked the town of Cardenas, twenty miles from Trinidad.

The insurgents fired eight cannon shots but did no damage. Finding it impossible to capture the town, the rebels on Friday came to a halt in the mountains and cut the telegraph wires, after which they fled.

James Brown, a Boston subject, has been expelled from the island for talking and acting against the interests of Havana.

Key West, Fla., Nov. 14.—The engineers by the steam-fleet have inspected the Weyler's trenches with 35,000 men, and they will now try to surround Manzanillo.

Spain's troops under Generals Munoz and Echague made an attack on the insurgents near Luna Ruhl. The insurgents had set dynamite in front of their entrenchments and waited the attack.

When the Spanish approached the insurgents exploded their dynamite, causing great loss of life. Munoz is reported killed and one of Echague's legs was blown off. It is reported in Havana that General Castellanos has been made a prisoner by General Gomez near Puerto Principe.
