Judge Marks-he was made probate judge by Sam Houston-has had a checkered career. Graduating from Union college in 1832, he studied was admitted to the bar, and went New Orleans. His conduct of that paper drew him into several duels, and be was indicted half a dozen times for libel. 1837, he met a fire-eater named Alex-ander on "the field of honor," and escaped with a bullet hole through coat. After this duel he started for Tex-as on horseback. At Houston he met the famous Sam Houston, then president of the Texan republic. Houston made him judge of the probate court at San Antonio. He remained in Texas a number of years, and then returned to Arkansas. All his life Judge Marks has been an active politician. first a whig, but afterwards became a republican, to which party he has belonged since it was born in 1856
