THE DENNY PHEASANT.

Fittingly Fills an Epoch in the Ilistory of Oregon Game Birds.

Thos. Smith of the Penny pheasant upon the haunts of the native birds. He holds that the Mongolian or China pheasant in no way interferes with the native pheasant, grouse or quail, giving as his reasons that the imported bird has entirely distinctive territory from that of the native birds. inasmuch as the former confines itself almost entirely to the grain fields of the open prairies, while the other use in the forests and mountains.

This is true as far as general habits are concerned; but in fermer years, before the advent of the Denny pheasant, it was the custom of the grouse to visit the grain fields of the valleys in large numers during the fall months when the birds were about grown. Now a grouse is seldom seen in the grain fields of the prairie, though that may be due, as Mr. Martin says, more to the hunter's gun than to inreads of the China pheasant. Mr. Martin states that the Denny

Mean or normal temperature, 48. The warmest month was that of 1889, with an average of 53. The coldest month was that of 1880, with an average of 40. The highest temperature was 81 on 22nd 1887. The lowest temperature was 18, on ord. 1896. Average date on which first killing frest occurred in autumn, October 14th Average date on which last killing frust occurred in spring, May 3rd. enactivereries (rain and melted snow). Average for the month, 3.74 inches.

Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 15. The greatest monthly precipitation was 8.61 inches in 1885.

The least monthly precipitation was 0.28 inches in 1885. The greatest amount of precipitation recorded in any 24 consecutive layers was 1.90 inches on 4th Grant 5.

The prevailing winds have been from the southwest. The highest velocity of the wind was 36 miles from the south-west on 27th 1895 also 1st and 19th,

The farmers of the United States ought to be very well satisfied with the first year's developments under President McKinley. Despite the democratic assertions that the adoption of a protective tariff would "destroy our foreign markets," the sales of agricultural products abroad in the calendar year 1897 were \$750,323,514 which is the largest sum ever realized by the farmers of the United States from sales of their products to other parts of the world, the next highest being in the last year of President Harrison's administration, 1892, when the exportation of farm products amoun-ted to \$12,539,832. The moment Presi-dent Cleveland and his free trade congrees came upon the scene of action, 18 01, there was a drop in the exportation of farm products amounting that year to \$610,135,633; in 1894 to only \$573,687,474; in 1895 only \$545,715,881, and in 1806, \$661,962,505.
