Gleams of Prosperity.

Silver Pros. have started a saw mill at S. 4th Bend.

The shingle mill at Sandpoint, Idaho is to be started again.

L. A. Steach is reported about to start a saw mill at Long Creek, Or.

William M. Keogh is putting in a shingle bolt camp at Suquamish.

The lumber business of Lane county is now in a most prosperous condition and all the mills are rushing orders.

The Methodist Church at Medford last week paid the mortgage of \$700 on their church property, thus clearing it from debt.

Gray's Harbor shipments for February were 20 cargoes of 7,000,000 feet. Hoquiam 10 cargoes, 2,217,000 feet. Aberdeen 10 cargoes, 2,217,000 feet. Cosmopolitan 10 cargoes, 1,529,000 feet.

A colony of about 50 immigrants from Minnesota passed over the C. & E. last week on their way to Lincoln county, where they expect to purchase land and go into manufacturing enterprises.

R. Sauter, the Dallas sawmill man, is about to close a contract for 3,000,000 feet of lumber in one bill for a sawmill company, which, if secured, will keep his mill running night and day for the next six months.

The Siskiyon mine below Happy Camp, on Klamath river, at the recent clean up took out \$100,000 and is working right along. The Chicago company in the same section have purchased the Elliott mines and other mineral land.

Dr. McConelli and Chimerne of San Francisco are prospecting the old Pacific mine, Klamath river. Supt. A. Smith is putting 40,000 feet of lumber into a mill on the Klamath river, on the old site of the low water insurance a long season.

The output of the Hudson mill, 1 1/2 miles north of Drain, for the year just closed was 2,500,000 feet of lumber of all kinds, mostly railroad timbers for the E. G. & W. R. Co. at Salt Lake, Utah, and the P. C. Co. at Yuba in California. This company also furnishes large contracts of four foot wood, and telegraph poles, amounting to several thousand dollars annually.

The Benton mills, of Corvallis, Or., are in receipt of a large order from Central America, amounting to 200 tons of flour, and the shipment will be made via San Francisco the coming week. These mills have been running on Central American demand almost all winter, but the output has been in the 50 to 60-ton quantities. These shipments are made in gunny bags each containing three 50-pound sacks.

A car load of machinery consisting of a 40 horse-power engine, boiler, and other pieces arrived here Saturday for the saw mill of Dunbar & Co. Sunday's load on the car up to Mattsonville where it was unloaded, and they now have it safely at their mill, two miles from the railroad. They expect the rest of their machinery soon, and it will not be long till the firm Dunbar & Co. will be competing successfully for their part of the lumber trade in this section of the country. - Drain Watchman.

Reports from the iron trade both here and in the East are in every way satisfactory. The production of pig iron on March 1 was at the rate of 254,400 tons per week, from 193 furnaces, an increase of nine furnaces during the month of February, and in the weekly output of 5002 tons. This is the largest output on record. Stocks March 1 were 799,094 tons, as compared with 770,284 tons January 1, and 736,356 tons January 1. The increase is comparatively small when the production is considered.

The war scare has not affected general business, and were war to be declared it is believed that it would stimulate rather than retard in the way of army requirements. The iron and steel interests, which are always crowded with orders for consumers in general, would be rushed to their utmost capacity. Gold is coming from Europe freely, and as exports of farm products during February were \$91,934,000, showing an increase of 30 per cent in breadstuffs, and 25 per cent in cotton, the condition of our foreign trade is healthy and goes a great way toward insuring a confident feeling.

On March 10 the Case Manufacturing Company, of Columbus, O., contracted with the Elgin Milling Company, of Elgin, Or., to build for them the most complete mill of its capacity in Oregon. The mill will be a fine example of modern machinery, and will be equipped with a boiler of considerable capacity is also included and the power to operate the plant will be furnished by a Russell automatic engine.

The Agricultural Department has just presented some statistics bearing on the crop, amounting to billions of farm products during the last twelve months which are extremely gratifying to the farmers of the country. They show an improvement in all lines of farm production and estimate an increase of 75 per cent over the preceding year. The increase in farm stock alone is stated at \$236,000,000. The statistics from which the total results are compiled to show the improvement to be well distributed over the country, no state or territory failing to report decided increases in farm and stock values.

Red cedar shingles are advancing every week. One week ago the Eastern selling price at the mill were \$4.50 for 4's and \$1.45 for cleats, now they are quoted at \$4.10 and \$1.50 respectively. This is due to the natural increase in business, scarcity of logs and other causes. There are now a flood of buyers in the market, shingles are hard to get, and no contracts for future delivery at like price are being made, while the production is freely made that "A" shingles will reach \$1.50 at the mill before long. The new organized Coast Lumber Company the Western business syndicate is already making its presence felt, offering 5 cents above all dealers and giving underweights to the mill. It is setting the pace for the wholesalers at present, and already is a large factor in the trade.
