**Poultry Notes.**

An excess of fat is conducive to sudden death from apoplexy.

An exclusive diet of soft food is detrimental to their digestive system.

If there is anything which makes poultry laugh, it is green cut bakes.

Always provide water vessels for ducks deep enough for them to clean out their noses.

Don't keep you culls and non-paying ones over the winter, turn them into cash now.

Ducks and geese are partial to soft feed and on this green food you will get the best results.

A just bath is to poultry what a good bath is to the human family. It makes them feel first class.

Fowls and orchards should be inseparable comrades, they are good company and are mutual benefactors.

Remember grit is to fowls what teeth are to the human family, and you all know the value of good teeth.

Miles seed is one of the best of poultry food and if scattered in leaves or straw will make the chickens lusty.

Too much condiments in the feed, such as pepper, ginger, cloves, etc., will prove too stimulating, but just enough is all right.

Charcoal is one of the best ingredients in the soft mash, or a box of it placed within the reach of the chicks will answer well.

Coal oil and cartolic acid are not friends of life, and the roosts painted with the mixture every week will in a great degree prevent their breeding.

There is one good thing about hens, and that is they are year-round income makers, and if properly handled they can't help it as they are "born that way."

Among the various articles of food which are considered the right thing, milk holds its own. It contains very much nutriment in a concentrated form, and if used properly will be found conducive to health.

On a farm, hens will get much more than half their living, during the summer picking up grain and seeds that would have been entirely wasted if they had not picked them up. Besides, they destroy thousands of noxious insects and worms that would injure the orchard and garden if left to multiply and increase.

It is hardly possible on the average farm to keep a strict account with a flock of hens which get the feed in other ways so one can hardly tell just where to place the whole cost of keeping them, but a mere detailed account of the number of eggs laid in a year, the number of chicks hatched, the amount received for eggs and poultry, will be an interesting table for reference, and if every one could be persuaded to do this, more people would give their poultry good care and the country would be richer.

A breeder of poultry, who has made a success of the business, says that if hens are rightly handled they will lay from one hundred and fifty to one hundred and seventy-five eggs a year, and at our average price for the year is about twenty-five cents a dozen here in New England, our hens should produce from \$12 to \$27 worth of eggs, says farm poultry. Sell her to market before she moults, and you add fifty cents more to the gross income, making \$3.92 to \$13.77 for each hen. Deduct \$1.25 for the cost of food, and we have the comfortable profit of \$2.67 to \$12.52 for each hen. Keep in mind that it is the winter eggs that pay the profit, and it is the pullets that we must look to for eggs in the winter. In order to get pullets to lay in the fall and have them produce a goodly supply of eggs all winter they must be early hatched and rightly handled. The late moulting and late laying pullets of this year mean late breeding birds next spring, consequently more late hatched chickens to mature late next autumn, and not begin to lay until another winter, one season lapsing over and crowding the others, thus late moulting birds producing the bulk of their eggs at a time when everybody's hens are laying, and the eggs can hardly be sold at a price at which they pay any profit. The converse of this is equally true. Early hatched pullets get to laying before cold weather, and keep laying will be abundantly broody in March, which enables another supply of early hatched chickens, the pullet of which will be laying before cold weather comes on, and freely all winter, giving us another generation of early brooders and more early hatched chickens.

The whole story of profitable poultry raising can be summed up in three short rules. First, hatch the chickens early; second, keep them growing, so the pullets come to laying maturity before cold weather; third, keep them laying to a great care and good food. The first of April is the best time to hatch chickens for fall and winter laying.—Poultry Herald.

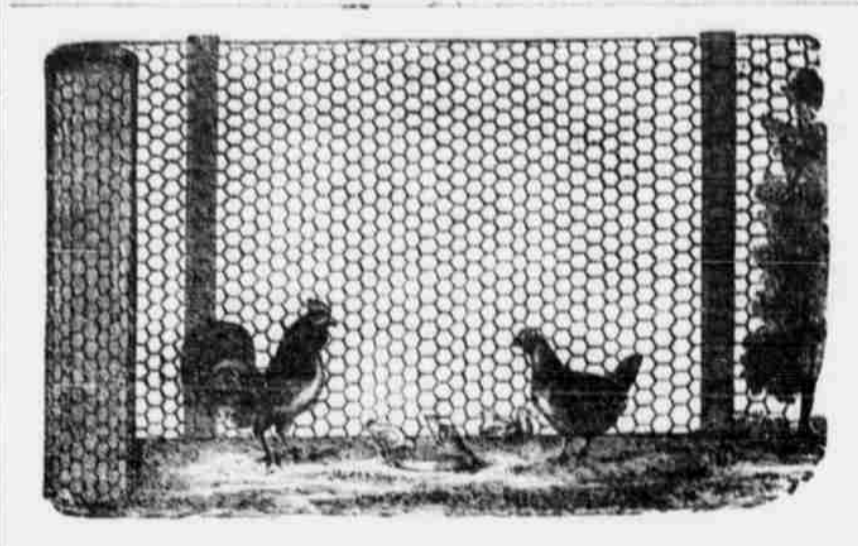
