NEW REVENUE BILL.

We give below special parts of the new revenue bill as we believe will be of interest to the general public. There are but few persons who are not in some way affected by it and every one should familiarize themselves with its provisions.

Section 2.—That from and after July 1, 1898, special taxes shall be, and hereby are, imposed annually as follows, that is to say: One.—Bankers using or employing a capital not exceeding the sum of \$25,000 shall pay \$50; when using or employing a capital exceeding \$25,000, for every additional thousand dollars in excess of \$25,000, \$2, and in estimating capital surplus shall be included.

Section 4.—That from and after July 1, 1898, special taxes on tobacco dealers and manufacturers shall be, and hereby are, imposed annually as follows, the amount of such annual taxes to be computed in all cases on the bases of the annual sales for the preceding year.

Section 6.—That on and after the first day of July, 1898, there shall be levied, collected and paid, for and in respect of the several bonds, debentures, or certificates of stock and of indebtedness, and other documents, instruments, matters, and things mentioned and described in schedule A of this act, or for in respect of the vellum, parchment, or paper upon which such instruments, matters or things, or any of them, shall be written or printed by any person or persons, or party who shall make, sign, or issue the same, or for whose use or benefit the same shall be made, signed or issued, the several taxes or sums of money set down in figures against the same, respectively, or otherwise specified or set forth in the said schedule.

Section 10.—That if any person or persons shall make, sign or issue, or cause to be made, signed or issued, or shall accept or pay, or cause to be accepted or paid, with design to evade the payment of any stamp tax, any bill of exchange, draft or order, or promissory note for the payment of money, liable to any of the taxes imposed by this act, without the same being duly stamped, or having thereon any adhesive stamp for denoting the tax hereby charged thereon, he, she or they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200, at the discretion of the court.

Section 13.—That any person or persons who shall register, issue, sell or transfer, or cause to be sold or transferred, any instrument document or paper of any kind or description whatsoever mentioned in schedule A of this act, without the same being duly stamped, or having thereon an adhesive stamp for denoting the tax charged thereon, and canceled in the manner required by law, with intent to evade the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$50, or by imprisonment not exceeding six months, or both, in the discretion of the court, and such instrument, document or paper not being stamped according to law, shall be deemed invalid and of no effect.

Section 14.—That hereafter no instrument, paper, or document required by law to be stamped, or with a deficient stamp, nor any copy thereof, shall be recorded or admitted, or used as evidence in any court until a legal stamp or stamps, denoting the amount of tax, shall have been affixed thereto as prescribed by law; provided, that any bond, debenture, certificate of stock, or certificate of indebtedness issued in any foreign country shall pay the same tax as is required by law on similar instruments when issued, sold, or transferred, in the United States; and the party to whom the same is issued, or by whom it is sold or transferred, shall, before selling or transferring the same, affix thereon the stamp or stamps indicating the tax required.

Section 15.—That it shall not be lawful to record or register any instrument, paper, or document required by law to be stamped unless a stamp or stamps of the proper amount shall have been affixed and canceled in the manner prescribed by law; and the record, registry, or transfer of any such instrument upon which the proper stamp or stamps aforesaid shall not have been affixed and canceled as aforesaid shall not be used in evidence.

Section 18.—That on and after the first day of July, 1898, notetraphy company or its agent or employee shall transmit to any person any dispatch or message without an adhesive stamp, denoting the tax imposed by this act, being affixed to a copy thereof, or having the same stamped thereon, and in default thereof shall incur a penalty of \$10.

Section 6.—That on and after the first day of July, 1898, there shall be levied, collected and paid, for and in respect of the several bonds, debentures, or certificates of stock and of indebtedness, and other documents, instruments, matters, and things mentioned and described in schedule A of this act, or for in respect of the vellum, parchment, or paper upon which such instruments, matters or things, or any of them, shall be written or printed by any person or persons, or party who shall make, sign, or issue the same, or for whose use or benefit the same shall be made, signed or issued, the several taxes or sums of money set down in figures against the same, respectively, or otherwise specified or set forth in the said schedule.

Section 9.—That in any and all cases where an adhesive stamp shall be used for denoting any tax imposed by this act, except as hereinafter provided, the person using or affixing the same shall write or stamp thereon the initials of his name and the date upon which the same shall be attached or used, so that the same may not again be used.

Section 11.—That if any person or persons shall make, sign or issue, or cause to be made, signed or issued, or shall accept or pay, or cause to be accepted or paid, with design to evade the payment of any stamp tax, any bill of exchange, draft or order, or promissory note for the payment of money, liable to any of the taxes imposed by this act, without the same being duly stamped, or having thereon any adhesive stamp for denoting the tax hereby charged thereon, he, she or they shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$200, at the discretion of the court.
