Lines written on the death of Private E. Hutchinson, of the Oregon Regiment of Volunteers, who died at sea, on the transport, City of Sidney, June 21, 1898, off Guam island, Ladrones isles, and was buried at sea with military and naval honors.

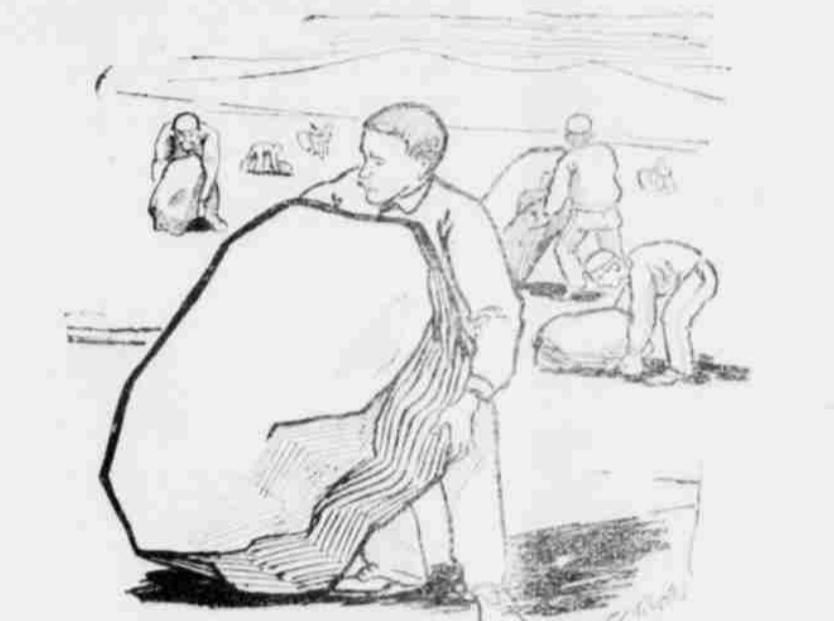
