

ORDERED MUSTERED OUT.
Oregon Artillery Among the First Troops to be Mustered Out.
 New York, Aug. 24.—A special to the Herald from Washington says:
 The number of volunteer regiments to be mustered out may be given out Thursday. The list has been practically agreed upon by the administration.
 These heavy regiments will be sent home: First Illinois, First Kentucky, First Ohio, First Texas, First Utah, First, Second and Third United States volunteers.
 These batteries of artillery will be mustered out: California battalion, First Colorado A, Connecticut light battery E and C; Connecticut heavy artillery A and B; G's six light artillery, Twentieth Indiana, Fifth and Sixth Iowa, A, B and C Louisiana light batteries, A, B, C and D Maine, heavy artillery, First Massachusetts: Fourth, Sixth and Seventh New York light batteries, First battalion Ohio light artillery, A and B Rhode Island light batteries, C Utah light batteries, Wisconsin light battery.
 These infantry regiments will be mustered out:
 Third Alabama (colored), Third Connecticut, First Delaware, First Florida, Third Georgia, Fourth, Seventh and Ninth Illinois, 157th, 169th and 191st Indiana, A and B First Indiana (colored), Fifth and Fifty-second Iowa, Twenty-second Kansas, Third and Fourth Kentucky, First Maine, Fifth Maryland, Fifth and Eighth Massachusetts, Thirty-second and Thirty-fifth Michigan, Fourteenth and Fifteenth Minnesota, Third Missouri, Fourth and Fifth Missouri, Second Nebraska, Nevada battalion, Taird and Fourth New Jersey, Twenty-second, Forty-seventh, 201st, 204th and 233d New York, Third North Carolina (colored), Seventh and Tenth Ohio, Second, Thirteenth, Fourteenth and Eighteenth Pennsylvania, First Rhode Island, Second North Carolina, Third and Fourth Tennessee, Third and Fourth Texas, First Vermont, Sixth Virginia, First Washington and Washington battalion, Second West Virginia, Fourth Wisconsin, Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Indian territory regiments.
 There are 28 batteries of artillery, nine regiments of cavalry and 62 regiments of infantry.
 These infantry regiments recruited up to the full strength number, 80,000 men; the cavalry, about 11,000, and the artillery about 6,000. The total number reaches 97,000.

FATAL ACCIDENT.
Boiler of a Thresher Engine Explodes on a Farm Near Eugene.
 Eugene, Aug. 25.—By the explosion of the boiler of an engine used to operate a thresher on the farm of J. E. Kirk, 15 miles west of here, early this morning, one man was instantly killed and five terribly scalded by escaping steam.
 The threshing crew was just preparing to begin work, and a group of men were standing about the engine, when without warning the boiler exploded, scattering pieces of iron and scattering steam in all directions.
 It is supposed that the boiler, which was an old one, became filled with water, on account of the gauge being out of order. The steam gauge registered 80 pounds just before the explosion occurred.
 Ellory Kirk was the man who was killed. Those injured by scalding water were: John Leasley, Henry McBe, Tony Bryant, James Bryant and Joseph Gibson.
