The following data for the month of September covering a period of 20 years, have been compiled from the weather bureau records at Roseburg, Oregon, and is furnished by Observer Gibson:

Mean or normal temperature, etc. The warmest month was that of 1888, with an average of 67. The coldest month was that of 1863, with an average of 57. The highest temperature was 99 on Oct. 18, 1888. The lowest temperature was 35, on Oct. 14th. Average date on which first killing frost occurred in autumn, October 14th.
