EXTRA SESSION CALLED

The Oregon Legislature to Meet September 26, 1898.

Governor Lord's Official Proclamation Calling a Special Session.

SALEM, OREGON, Sept. 8, 1898.
Governor Wm. P. Lord today at 2 o'clock p. m., made public his proclamation authorizing an extra session of the Oregon legislature. It has been known for some time that such action would probably take place before the time for the regular session, and while the news is no surprise to the public, there is a keen interest in the event.

THE PROCLAMATION.
STATE OF OREGON,
EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT,
September 8, 1898.

Whereas, matters of vital importance to the people of the State of Oregon seem to require the convening of the legislative assembly in special session.
Now, therefore, I, Wm. P. Lord, by virtue of the authority in me vested as Governor of the State of Oregon, do hereby direct the convening of the two houses of the legislative assembly of the State of Oregon, in special session, at the State Capitol, in Salem, on Monday, September 26, 1898, at 10 o'clock a. m., of which all who shall, at that time, be entitled to act as members of said body, are hereby required to take notice.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Oregon, this 8th day of September, A. D. 1898.
W. M. P. LORD, Governor.

When asked concerning the specific objects of the extra session, and the work expected to be done by it, Governor Lord would make no statement, but said that his official message to the assembled legislators would be the only message he had to give out. His Excellency's mind had for some time been made up to call an extra session, and it is the general belief that the main objects of the same will be to elect a United States senator and make appropriations to take up the interest-bearing warrants.

Secretary Kincaid was seen, and was overwhelmed with work preparing for the coming event. It will require much work to get everything in readiness and provide the necessary supplies. Considerable of the stationery and supplies bought for the last regular session is still unused, and enough will be bought to complete the list. Matters will be lively from now on, and great things are expected. The extra session can last but twenty days.

WHALING FLEET LOST.
At Least Three Vessels Crushed in the Ice.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 6.—A special to the Examiner from Seattle says that news of a terrible disaster to the Arctic whaling fleet came in the following letter from Captain J. C. Downing, of the steamer Wolcott to Austin Claiborne, the local agent of the Pacific Steam Whaling Company.

"JENNA, August 29.—I arrived from the westward this evening. The latest from the Arctic is that all the vessels that were caught in the ice were lost. Mason, captain of the Jeanne, is crazy. I obtained the above information from Captain Ned Jensen, pilot of the gunboat Wheeling.
Mr. Claiborne believes that only the whaling vessels originally caught in the ice above Point Barrow were destroyed. These included the Wanderer, Jessie H. Freeman, Belvidere, Orca, Kosaria, Newport, Fearless and Jeanette.
Rev. Sheldon Jackson, who returned on the Roanok, reported that the Belvidere got out and reached Fort Clarence, where she coaled August 4, from the bark J. D. Peters. She then returned to Point Barrow. The Belvidere's officers also told Mr. Jackson that the Roanok had been crushed in the ice, and that the Wanderer had extricated herself and moved on to the vicinity of Herschel island.

As the Orca and Jessie H. Freeman were destroyed last fall, the natives tried to burn the latter, but she, it would appear that the only vessels remaining at the mercy of the ice floes and jans were the Jeanne, Newport and Fearless. But, besides the eight vessels named there were the Belana, Orampus, Belo, Narwal and Mary D. Humm remaining in that part of the Arctic.
Captain Edwin Goodall, of San Francisco, who came down on the Alki said: "Captain Downing told me that the fleet was destroyed in the ice break-up. He got his information from Pilot Jensen, of the United States gunboat Wheeling. Jensen was told of the disaster at Kotzebue sound. Downing heard of no lives being lost and it is supposed no deaths occurred."

OREGON RECRUITS.
Governor Lord Asks That They be Either Mustered Out or Sent to Manila.

SALEM, Sept. 5.—Governor Lord returned from Seal Rock today and forwarded the following dispatch to Adjutant-General Corbin:
"Adjutant-General Corbin, Washington, D. C.: I earnestly request that the 329 recruits to fill the Sec. Oregon regiment to the maximum be either mustered out and sent to homes in Oregon, or that they be promptly forwarded to their regiment at Manila. These men were recruited three months ago, and in the latter part of June the mustering officer, under order of the war department, sent them in details, without uniforms or equipments from their various stations as far as mustered, in charge of one of their number to San Francisco, where they now are, as reported to me, in disorganized and demoralized condition, many of them suffering from physical and moral life for want of proper care, discipline, sanitation and camp regulations. I beseech your active interference.

Was It Andree?
CHICAGO, Sept. 4.—A special to the Times-Herald from Winnipeg Manitoba, says:
Indians reaching Dauphin from the far north report meeting an Eskimo who told of the appearance among them of a strange man, who descended from the clouds on the shores of Hudson bay. The opinion among the whites is that the man is Andree, the Arctic explorer.

THE CITY COUNCIL.
Proceedings of the Regular Meeting Held Monday Evening.

The common council of the city of Roseburg met at the city hall Monday night, Sept. 8th, and transacted the following business:
On roll call the following were present: Mayor Marsters, Councilmen Parks, Willis, Benson, Fields and Stearns, Marshal Dillard and Recorder Rice. Absent, Shambrook, Perry and Aiken.
The resignation of D. R. Shambrook as councilman in the first ward was read and accepted.
The election of C. W. Farrett as chief engineer and F. P. Brown as assistant chief of the Roseburg fire department was upon motion confirmed by the council.
The insurance on the city hall and contents was ordered renewed in the same amounts and manner as before.
The committee on election reported the following recommendations for polling places and judges and clerk thereof, for the election to be held Monday, October 5, 1898:

Rolling place 1st ward, court house judges, Fred Tolles, A. Parks and I. K. Richardson; clerks, E. E. Richards and C. Y. Benjamin.
Polling place 2nd ward, Stearns's Hall; judges, W. P. Benjamin, O. W. Kezarote and H. C. Stanton; clerks, Kinzer Caro and D. S. West.
Polling place 3rd ward, Depot Hotel; judges, H. L. Marsters, W. J. Lander and J. A. Buchanan; clerks, Fred Fields and John Civians.
Polling place 4th ward, City Hall, judges, L. F. Rice, S. C. Pitt and W. Stewart; clerks, J. C. Aiken and J. B. Cannon.
Upon motion the report was accepted and the recorder ordered to give ten days notice by publication in a newspaper of said election, polling places, and judges and clerks thereof, and that the following officers were to be elected:
In 1st ward one councilman to serve two years; in 2nd ward one councilman to serve two years; in 3rd ward one councilman to serve two years; in 4th ward two councilmen to serve one year and one to serve two years; also the general officers of one marshal, one recorder, one treasurer, to serve one year each.
The marshal's and recorder's monthly reports were read and adopted.

WOODMEN OF THE WORLD.
Items of Interest Gathered at the Recent Head Camp Session.
The following items of interest are gathered from the head officers' reports at the recent head camp session:
We have a beneficial membership in good standing of 41,640.
In 1893 we had three assemblies: in 1891, 14; in 1892, 14; in 1893, 13; in 1894, 14; in 1895, 10; in 1896, 10; in 1897, 12; in 1898, 10.
In two years (1896-1897, 1897-1898), we have taken into the beneficiary fund \$92,624.00, and paid out \$96,103.29.
The largest amount taken in as beneficiary was \$28,000, last June.
Golden Gate camp, San Francisco, has had the largest number of deaths since our institution—29.
We have had 480 deaths since institution.
Woods and Head River camps are the only ones in Oregon that have disbanded.
Ten camps have disbanded in this jurisdiction.
Total number camps now in force, 490. Average income at each camp, \$7.
California has 104 camps, Colorado 181, Idaho 20, Montana 39, Nevada 3, Oregon 104, Utah 10, Washington 7, Wyoming 17.
Colorado has a membership of 11,241; Oregon 14,547; California 61,719; Washington 3,615; Montana 2,295; Idaho 1,145; Utah 874; Wyoming 221; Nevada 87.
We are now carrying insurance in force to the amount of \$12,263,990.
We have just had a visitation and inspection since April 1, 1898, 4,200 members, but have increased our membership in that month 15,240.
Denver camp has made the largest increase, they having put in 373 new members. Golden Gate coming next with 345—Oregon Woodmen.
