WASHINGTON, Sept.7,-Late in the day the following was given out at the war department

"In response to the request of the governors of some of the states for the muster-out of their entire volunteer force, But I just can't be nothin' 'cause I got the president replied in substance, as follows:

" 'Answering your telegraphic request for the muster-cut of your regiments, ! have already determined that 100,000 of the vofunteers shall be mustered out of the service. This is because, in my judgment, that number can be spared. About 100,000 will remain, as the government now requires in Cuba, Porto Rico, and the Phillipines a larger army than I'd like to be a cowboy an' rope the the regular military establishment affords. 


