An attempt was made by the Corbett faction, on Monday evening, to give his candidacy the seal of party sanction and authority, by giving him a pro-tem caucus nomination.

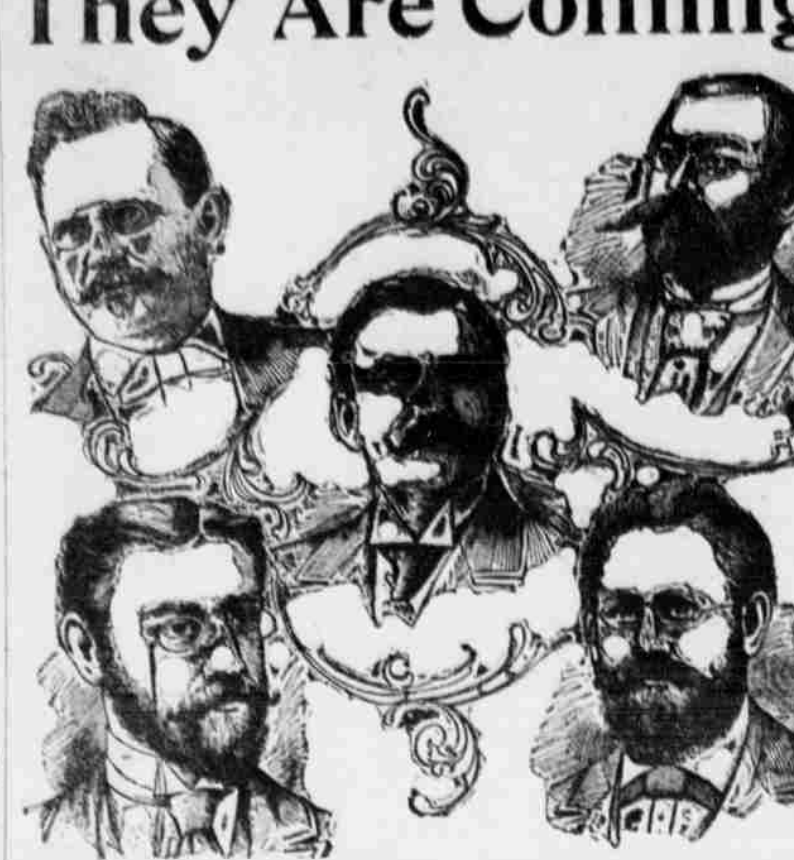
