Ex-Convict Tells a Harrowing Tale.

A. Geary, ex-convict from Union county, who arrived in the city yesterday from Eugene, where he has been engaged in cutting wood since his release from the penitentiary October 17, tells a story of alleged mistreatment of prisoners at the state penitentiary. He says the food is poor and inadequate and the work hard, and that when discharged, instead of receiving a suit of clothes, \$5 in cash and their railroad fare back home, as the law provides, the convicts get only a shoddy suit of clothes.

What he calls particular attention to, however, is the whipping post which is used by the superintendent in the most approved fashion. The prisoners are strapped to it and given from 10 to 150 lashes on their bare backs. One offender received 125 lashes, and soon afterwards went insane and died in the asylum. During the 16 months he was there he saw 20 men flogged. The lashes are applied with great vigor, and neither the groans of pain nor the pitiful appeals of the hapless victims avail.

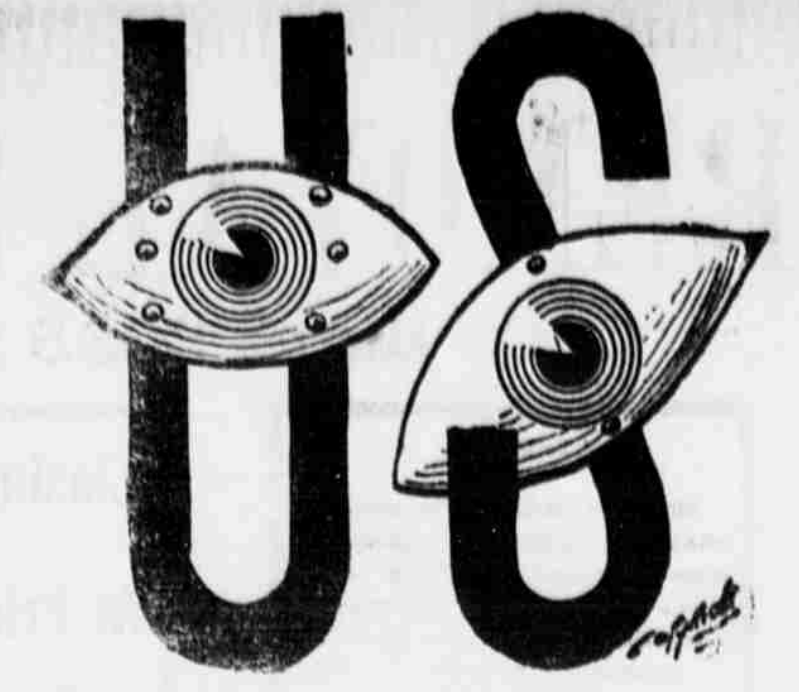
