Books Built by the State. Prof. V. L. Stone, M.A., of Emory college, Georgia, in his review, makes an elaborate argument in favor of good roads, and suggests that the state construct in each county, one road extending east and west direction, and one extending in a north and south direction, and the roads of one county to connect with the similar roads of adjoining counties, so as to form a continuous system of first-class roads extending over the state. These roads to be thoroughly surveyed and located by competent engineers, the cost fully estimated and the details of construction prepared before the work is begun. These roads would be object lessons to the counties, and vitiate them to the highest perfection. The farmer will be essentially benefited by improved roads to market.

Ohio's Equitable Road Law. The road system of Ohio is admirably adapted to the end proposed; the county paying a part of the costs and the property owners, within a reasonable distance on either side, contributing the remainder.
