Died.

At his Civil Bend home, Friday, June 9, 1899, David L. Moore, aged a little more than 64 years. Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Miller Saturday, and the remains were interred in the Civil Bend cemetery.

David Lyons was born March 24, 1835, in Schuyler county, Ill., and came to Oregon in 1847, accompanying his parents across the plains with an ox-team. He first settled in the Willamette valley and came to this county in 1878. He located near Brockway and has since lived in that vicinity. He was married the first time in 1863 to Sarah I. Campbell, and was again married in 1879 to M. A. Bolinger. He was an honored old Oregon pioneer, who has been identified with the advancement and upbuilding of our state from its very infancy. He is well known throughout this county and held in the highest esteem by all. He leaves six grown children to mourn his loss, among whom is Mrs. P. C. Ream, of this city.
