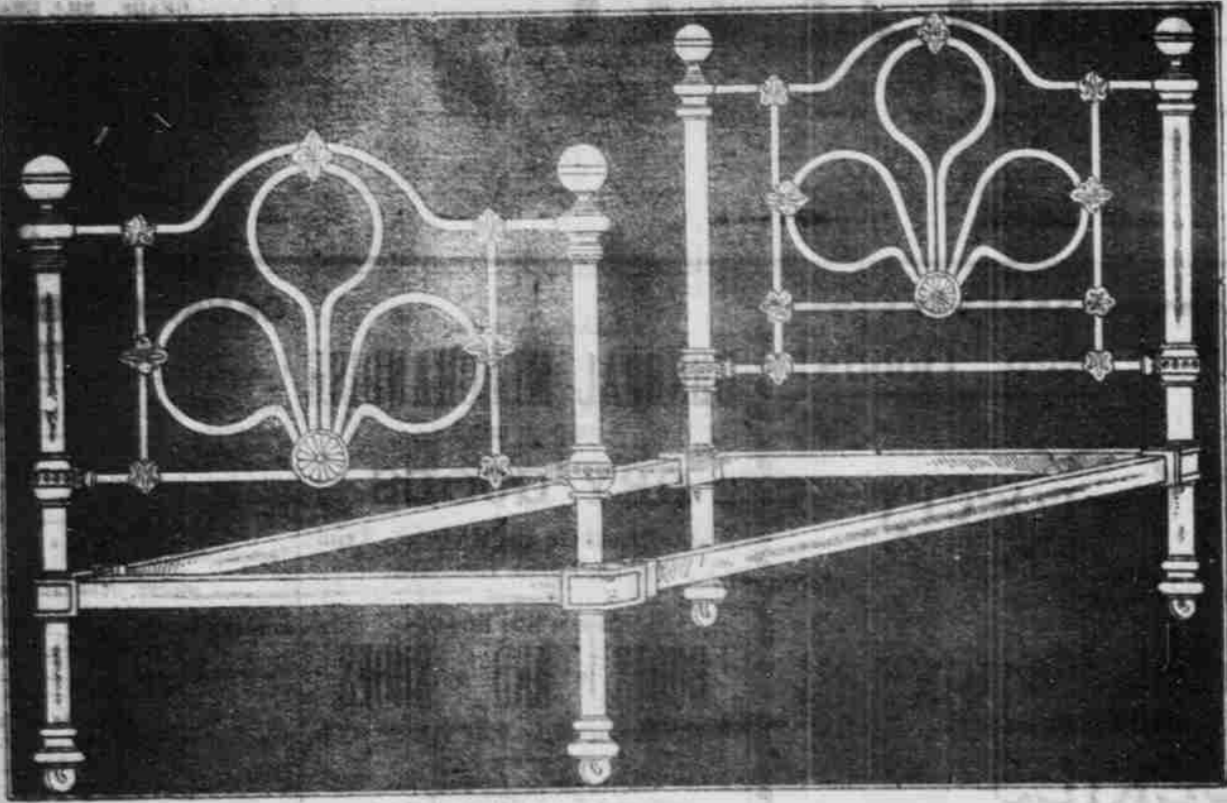

Oregon Game Laws Boiled Down for Ready Reference.
For the benefit of hunters, the game laws of Oregon are here presented in a very brief form.

Birds—Nightingale, skylark, gray singing thrush, black thrush, linnet, goldfinch, greenfinch, chadchuck, bullfinch, redbreasted European robin, black starting grosbeak, Oregon robin or meadow lark, mocking bird, close season lasts the year around. Eggs and nests are exempt from disturbance.

Deer—Close season, late of November to 10th of July following. Cannot be hunted for market at all.

Moose and mountain sheep—Same as deer.
Pheasant and Mongolian pheasant—Same as grouse.
Squirrels—Close season perpetual.

Partridge—Same as grouse.
Quail—Same as grouse.
Swan—Same as ducks.
