### HARVEST TIME IS HERE.

#### Grain and Hay Crops. Prospects for Hops and Fruit.

The rain which fell on the 25th last, was of great benefit to all vegetation, but was not considered to be sufficient in amount to answer all requirements.

The wheat crop continues in excellent condition, especially the fall sown, which has filled well and is of good quality. In some sections reports as to the condition of spring wheat are not so promising as they were. The warm weather and lack of rain have prevented filling to some extent, and the outlook is not encouraging. The damage appears to be confined principally to that sown on summer fallow. There are a few minor reports of rust. Oats are in excellent condition, but need more rain. Harvesting has commenced and much of the fall-sown wheat is in the shock. Some threshing has been carried on during the week in Southern Oregon.

Hay is practically over, and the most flattering reports are received regarding the excellent and abundant crop secured. The second crop of clover and alfalfa is being cut.

Hops are in bloom and the vines are in a healthy condition. Spraying was continued during the week in all of the yards, which, aided by the high temperatures, practically destroyed the lice.

The hot weather has been favorable to the growth of corn.

Potatoes are in blossom, but need more rain. Indications point to a short crop. Gardens have made good growth; rain is badly needed.

There is no change in the fruit prospects. Reports received from Benton county state that there will be plenty of apples and pears for local use, but some for shipment; the estimate is placed at about 25 per cent of a full crop. Apples are dropping in sections of Washington county. Peaches are ripe and in market in the southern counties. Cherry marketing is over. Blackberries continue to ripen; indications point to a short crop.

The large onion crop of Washington county promises well.

Pastures on foothills are drying up, except where mountain streams keep them green; those in the valleys are in very good condition.

Stock is in excellent form.

Excepting the burning of spring grain, which has occurred in several counties of the state, the crop prospects of Oregon are in a fair condition.

Secretary of State Dunbar has issued warrants in favor of the several county treasurers for the amount due each county respectively from the United States 5-per cent road fund. The apportionment is in proportion to the acreage of the various counties. Benton's acreage is given at \$12,000, and the apportionment was \$10,000. In all, the state got nearly \$1500.
