Call for the National Convention has been issued

CHICAGO, March 3.—The following official call for the meeting of the National Republican League was issued today: "In accordance with a resolution of the executive committee, the 12th convention of the National Republican League is hereby called to meet in the city of St. Paul, Tuesday, July 17, 1900. Each delegate shall be entitled to seats in the convention hall with their respective delegations. The president and secretary of state and territorial leagues or the proper officials to sign and certify to the credentials of the delegates from their respective leagues. All delegates should be provided with such credentials. "The business before the convention will be: Reports of officers, reports of permanent and special committees, consideration of amendments to the constitution, consideration of a financial policy for the maintenance of the national organization, election of officers, naming time and place for the next national convention, or reference of any matters, and the consideration of any matters which may relate to national or state league organizations for the good of the republican party.
