Nearly 2000 Lane county voters have registered. This probably leaves 1400 or 1500 to register.

Fifty carloads of railroad ties have been shipped from La Grande for the Union Pacific system.

Law Palmer at Haystack, who is serving a term in Wyoming for manslaughter, has been granted a new trial. He was a candidate for Commissioner of Grant county in 1899. His acquittal is now expected.

The Klamath Falls town election on the 12th was spirited, 103 ballots being cast. The officers elected are: Treasurer, W. W. Henson, Otto Heidrich, J. H. Schallack, S. E. Martin, J. G. Jones; Recorder, C. L. Parrish; Treasurer, J. W. Siemens.

Judge Eggen has appointed Herbert Hanna of Eugene, official reporter of the Eighth Judicial District, in place of B. L. Stowell, says the Union Republican.

It is the opinion of many of our ranchers with whom we have spoken on the subject, says the Vale (Mather county) Gazette, there will be considerable water during the coming season, in spite of the lack of snow in the mountains. They say that as the ground has not been frozen the rain and snow water has sunk and this will feed the springs until late in the season.

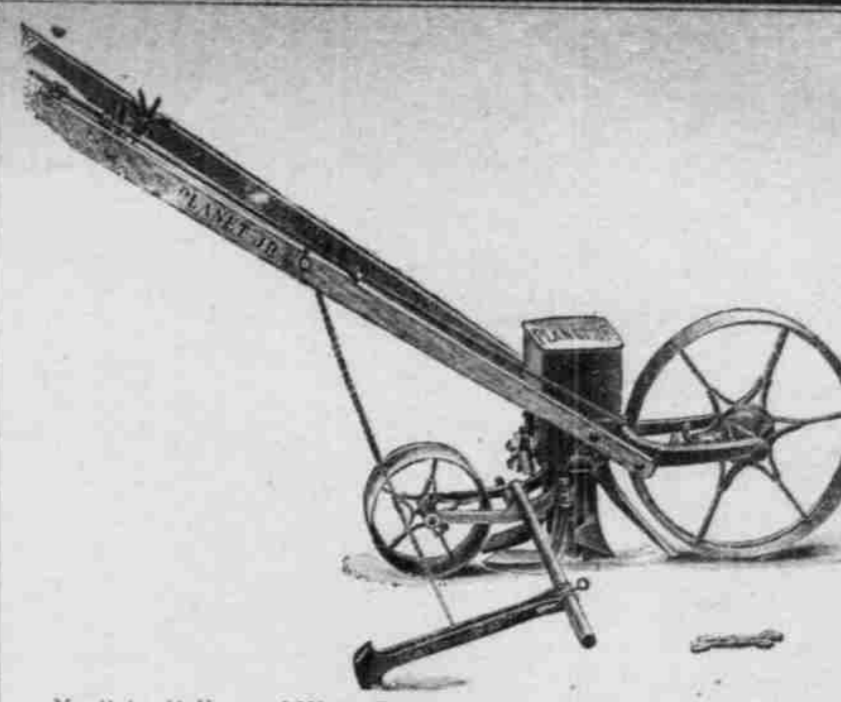
