The Republicans Did It.

The following frank acknowledgment that the bill providing for the reduction of officer's salaries of this county originated and was piloted through the legislature by our republican senator, the late lamented A. W. Reed, is taken from last Thursday's (May 3) issue of the Roseburg Review in which we find a blunt refusal of the claims set forth in the card of County Clerk Gazley, printed above, of which hundreds of copies are being distributed throughout the county.

THE REVIEW'S ADMISSION:

"Senator Reed introduced a bill reducing and readjusting the salaries of the officials of Douglas county and in order to insure its passage the Union representatives, Wilson, Wonacott and Conn, introduced no measure, but came to the support of Mr. Reed's bill."

When the facts are further considered that Mr. Reed was pledged before and after election to accomplish this legislation and true to the characteristics of our republican legislators, fully redeemed his pledges, the actions of Mr. Gazley in attempting to deceive the people and claim for himself this honor, are too ridiculous to be ludicrous. Furthermore, in the foregoing affidavit of Mr. Gazley, it will be plainly seen that no provisos were made whatever for impending legislation. He simply made affidavit to refund to the county \$500 of his salary on or before a certain date and that he failed to keep this promise and thus deceived his constituency is well known throughout the county. Thus it will be found upon investigation that the boasted claims of the fusionists for economy and great savings to the county during their administration, are all bosh. What savings having really been made being directly attributed to the republicans.

No Incompetency Here.

The office of county clerk is one of the most important of the county offices. The clerk has more direct dealings with the great number of the people than perhaps any other officer. It is important that he should be able to keep the county records in a systematic manner. It is also very important that he should be accommodating and always ready to help or assist in examining records or in other ways which occur in his line. Men are not plentiful who combine both these qualifications. In David R. Shambrook we find a man possessing all of these qualifications and eminently well fitted in every respect to conduct the office to the satisfaction of all. It will be noticed that he is not attempting any grand stand plays to the public to win votes, but expects to win wholly upon true merit. Stand by the soldier boy, he deserves your support.

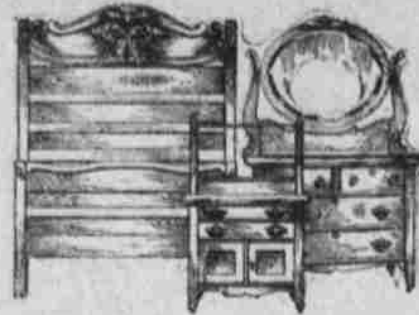
