attendance. In business and political circles interest in the question is running high. The convention is purely of a non-partisan character, no branch of trade being excluded and no political party being exempt from representation. The main purpose of the convention is to memorialize Congress to re-enact the Chinese Exclusion act, which will expire next May. The desire is to make the memorial as strong as possible, as it is felt that in the large Eastern cities there will be some activity in favor of the repeal of the law. Senator Perkins, Congressman Needham and Woods and H. A. Mason, secretary of the League of Municipalities, as well as a number of other men prominent in affairs on the Pacific Coast, are taking an active interest in the movement.

RAILWAY UNIONS TO UNITE.

OTTAWA, Ont. Nov. 20.—The organization of a national railway union, to include the conductors, engineers, firemen, brakemen and telegraphers of the Canadian lines, will probably result from a conference in session today. The prospectus gives as one of the objects of the union the combining of the strength of all these orders, whose head will be a British subject, so that when grievances occur the men will not be subject to the humiliation of being refused assistance by the railway management on the ground that their representative is a foreigner. It is proposed that the orders in the Dominion sever their official connection with those of the United States, though maintaining fraternal relations.

MISTAKE CAUSED A TACOMA BANK FAILURE.

TACOMA, Wash. Nov. 19.—The Metropolitan Bank failed today as a result of a run which started over a misunderstanding with regard to a suit filed against a defunct bank of similar name. The deposits amount to \$500,000. Dwight Phelps has been appointed receiver.

The officers of the Metropolitan, which is a successor to the old Metropolitan Savings Bank, are: P. D. Caesar, president; T. W. Enos, vice-president; and O. B. Selvig, cashier. The bank was capitalized at \$500,000.

Mormonism a Menace.

New York, Nov. 16.—"The danger of Mormonism is underrated, not overrated. When the public realizes that there are two Mormon churches in Book 70, one in Manhattan, one in Philadelphia, a strong and growing Mormon settlement on the borders of Pennsylvania and New Jersey, and that the strongest church in a section 50 miles from Jersey City is Mormon, it may be understood that the situation is menacing."

This statement, which started the women's executive committee of the domestic missions of the Reformed Church at its 18th anniversary in this city, was made by Miss Elizabeth V. Vermye, a member of the committee in an address before a Mormonism in the East. She said further:

"It was predicted that in 50 years the Mormon would control a belt of states cutting the country in two from north-east to south-west. They own land on the Rocky Mountains to the Sierras and are spreading East as I have told you. They control four western states, and at the present rate of progress in others will have supremacy."
