The Rich Fields Uncovered Will Rival Those of California or Texas

INVESTORS WILL REAP A HARVEST

The old days of Titusville and Oil City, where fortunes were made in a night will be completely outdone by the magnificent oil fields to be uncovered and developed in Southern Oregon.
