### LEGISLATIVE CANDIDATES.

The harmonious action of the county convention last Saturday in selecting candidates for county offices has resulted, as it naturally would, in giving entire satisfaction to the members of the republican party. It was a convention of able men from all parts of the county, and they endeavored to perform the duties imposed on them with discretion and in careful obedience to the wishes of their constituents. So far as the nomination of county ticket is concerned, so were they all that the majority of the prominent nominations were made by acclamation. It was so when it came to naming or rather renominating candidates for the offices of county judge, sheriff, clerk, treasurer, two commissioners and coroner. For the other county offices there were several candidates, all good men, and the brief contest which ensued ended by cordial congratulations from the vanquished to the victors. Such good feeling between the candidates and the various delegations is a most reliable assurance of success at the polls, especially when each and every candidate is so well qualified and fitted for the office for which he has been named. The ticket is composed of a clean, honest, upright and consecu-

FRANK H. RIDDLE.

The senior nominee for representative is a well educated and practical business man of the Gardiner and Lake precincts. He was born in New London, Conn., in 1864, but removed to Council Bluff, Iowa, when three years of age, where he resided until 18 years of age and at which place he received his education. In 1882 he removed to Ord, Neb., where he learned the printer's trade and worked on the "Ord Quiz" for a number of years. He married Miss Addie E. McMurphy, who was then acting in the capacity of book keeper for that paper. Soon afterwards he became editor and publisher of the "Barwell, Neb. Gazette" which paper he made a complete success, both as a news medium and a financial investment. He removed to Oregon in 1889 and was engaged by the Florence firm of Meyer & Kyle general merchants and shippers of lumber and canned salmon as book keeper and deputy postmaster. Soon afterwards he resigned this position to accept a similar one with the late Senator A. W. Baugh and remained in his employ until a short time before his death, when he was appointed postmaster at Gardiner. He is a very intelligent and wide awake gentleman, familiar with the needs and requirements of the county and in whose hands the county's best interests will be guarded in the lower branch of the Oregon legislature. He is opposed to jobbery and extravagance and will do all in his power to curtail needless expenditures of the state's funds. He is a man for whom you can safely cast your ballot.

HON. JOHN WENAMAKER, ex post master General, leading citizen of Philadelphia and one of the foremost business men of the world says: I heartily approve of the idea of giving the people a veto on corrupt legislation. The movement to secure for the people a more direct and immediate control over legislation shall have my support. I trust such a movement will receive the thoughtful attention of all who would improve our political and industrial conditions.
