Society Meetings.

A. U. W.—Roseburg Lodge No. 16, meets the second and fourth Mondays of each month at 7:30 p. m. in the L. O. F. Hall. Members having classes preparing for either of these examinations should notify the County Superintendent in time that the proper arrangements may be made.

No pupil will be permitted to take the examination until his teacher shall certify that he or she has finished all the branches prescribed for the eighth grade and is ready for the first examination.

All branches must be taken at the first examination. If the required percentage are made a diploma will be granted. If failure is made in not more than two branches, these may be taken at a sub-sprint examination, and if successful, diploma will be issued.

A failure in any one branch the second time requires the pupil to begin again and take all the branches at the next examination.

The new tax law will bring us the largest per capita for the April appointment that we have ever had. During the month of March over \$20,000 in taxes was paid to the sheriff. This necessitates the writing of over 3000 receipts and requires a great deal of book work before a final accounting could be made with the County Treasurer, which must be done before the school fund is set aside by the treasurer. Thus our April appointment has been unavoidably delayed for a few days for the counting of the money.
