

## LATE NEWS SUMMARY

### Important Events of the Past Few Days.

### STATE, GENERAL, FOREIGN.

### Cream of the Dispatches Dished Up in Condensed Form for the Busy Reader.

The Chicago World Fair Company still has \$600,000 profits to give stockholders.

The 4-year-old daughter of W. Tillman of The Hyles fell backwards into a tub of boiling water. She died from her injuries.

Three Japs were arrested at Meacham and brought to Pendleton on the charge of killing songbirds in violation of the law the other day.

The total number of prisoners in the Oregon penitentiary at Salem is 318, as 314 confined in the penitentiary of the State of Washington.

The graduating class of the Oregon Agricultural College will consist of 28 this year. They will not appear in cap and gowns, it having been otherwise decided.

The census returns relating to manufacturers in the United States shows the number of wage-earners in 1900 as 53,321,000, which is an increase of 25 per cent over the number employed in 1890.

The Chinese section going on the Southern Pacific Corvallis has been replaced by a force of white laborers. The company made the change in response to a petition signed by the business men of the town.

How our manufacturers invading the west? The Boston Transcript says that even when it comes to the creation of an English King, an American manufacturer is supplying London with thousands of "official" sovereign buttons.

The number of shipments from Oregon in 1901 amounted to about 24,000 carloads. Present indications show that this year's shipments will exceed those of last year by more than 50 per cent. It would seem that the future possibilities in this direction are infinite.

Uncle Sam continues to get John Bull's money. According to recent English statistics \$35,000,000 represents the value of the horses exported from the United States to Great Britain since 1855. In addition to this 36,000,000 worth of mules have gone to South Africa.

The papers have had a good deal to say about Prof. Leibnitz of New York City, who is trying to practice life chemically. He thinks life is pretty close to the solution. But ten to one he is not. Work has begun at Grant's Pass on the New Masonic temple. When completed, the new temple will be the largest and finest structure in Grant's Pass. It will be 100x55 feet, three stories high and built of brick. The lower floor will be used as store-rooms, the second for offices and the upper floor will be the lodge room, banquet rooms, etc. The whole building will be elaborately finished.
