SPECIAL MEETING BOARD TRADE:

Bonus is Raised and Creamery Plant is Assured.

A special meeting of the Douglas County Board of Trade was held Thursday evening to take final action on the creamery proposal for Roseburg. C. S. Jackson chairman of committee on soliciting bonus of \$500 reported that our citizens had responded liberally and were generally enthusiastic in regard to securing such a valuable and important industry and manufacturing institution in this county. The committee reported \$470 already subscribed and the list was turned over to the board of managers with the recommendation that the remaining \$30 be secured at the earliest possible date to make up the full \$500 bonus. The board of managers were also instructed to enter into an agreement with Mr. Gardner of Albany, embodying the construction, completion and operation of a creamery plant in Roseburg the bonus to be turned over to him upon the fulfillment of this agreement. Mr. Gardner was present and stated that he was ready to enter into this agreement and commence the erection of a creamery building and the installation of his machinery plant therein at once. Thus a first class creamery is to be built in Roseburg.
