Important Events of the Past Few Days.

STATE, GENERAL, FOREIGN.

Cream of the Dispatches Dished Up in Condensed Form for the Busy Reader.

The Senate has passed the River and Harbor bill.

Baker City will sprinkle its own streets this season.

Only about half of the voters have registered in Jackson county.

President Roosevelt signed the bill last Saturday repealing the war revenue taxes.

A general strike and closing of the street-car lines occurred at San Francisco, Saturday night.

A petition is being circulated in Josephine County for the establishment of a free county high school.

The oil company at Ashland has decided to close down 2,000 if it becomes necessary.

The cleanup of the dirt washed during the winter has begun at Dawson.

The estimate for the season by conservative judges runs to \$30,000,000.

A blizzard covered the states of Nevada, Utah, Idaho and Wyoming Monday.

A big loss of stock resulted. The thermometer registered 80 in the shade Monday at Chicago, and Omaha also sweltered with heat.

The hot waves which struck this city yesterday continued, and at 9 o'clock this morning the mercury stood at 82, with prospects of reaching a record height before night.
