

#### AVENGED HIS FATHER'S DEATH,

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., July 1 .- "There's the man who until the womanly health is established. killed my father." As Ray Smith, 21, uttered these words he fired twice at Judge David Rogers, who was entering the dining room of Smith's Hotel at Maynard, Union county. Judge Rogers fell dead, pierced by two bullets. The tragedy was the sequel of a murder which occurred in this city July 16, 1896, when Judge Rogers killed G. W. Smith, father of Ray, in a pistol duel in a saloon. The boy swore to avenge his father's death with the life of his slayer, and did so. He escaped and is at large.


