RECKLESSNESS OF HUNTERS.

Alfred Neal Mistaken for a Deer and shot by Late Parazzo.

The season is now at hand when we may read of the usual deplorable "mistaken for a deer" shootings, which amounts to no less than almost criminal carelessness on the part of the reckless hunter. Late last week a shooting of this nature was recorded in this county. While hunting Thursday morning in the mountains between Ocala and Canas Valley, Alfred Neal, a young man about 29 years of age, was accidentally shot by his companion, Late Parazzo. The bullet entered his back just below the right shoulder, and came out above the right lung, without breaking any bones, although it is feared a nerve has been severed which will deprive him of complete use of the fingers on his right hand which are now paralyzed; this will be ascertained as soon as an operation is permissible. When the boys reached their hunting ground, Neal separated from Parazzo with the intention of making a half circuit to visit some neighboring campers for the purpose of searching for his dog which had strayed away some few days ago, intending after waiting join his companion. Neal had not proceeded far when he suddenly started a deer in the bush. Unknown to him, Parazzo had also seen the animal and was trying to get a shot at it while Neal was moving through the shrubbery to head it off, and it was at this juncture Parazzo mistook Neal for the deer and fired at a distance of 150 yards with his 42-40 Winchester rifle. Neal was able to be brought to Roseburg and was taken to Dr. Hentock's office where treatment was administered. The young man will, it is thought, recover in a few weeks.
