

Particulars of Gervais Fire.

GERTAVS, ORE., Oct. 6.—Fire last night wiped out the business portion of Gervais, two blocks of business houses being swept by the flames. The fire started shortly after 10 o'clock and originated either in a confectionery store in the middle of the block or in the alley back of Weis' furniture store. All buildings destroyed were frame, with the exception of the old brick bank building. The only business houses left standing were M. S. Pechner's general merchandise store and Scott Taylor's harness shop. The water tank also burned, and no water could be obtained with which to fight the fire.

The city had no fire apparatus, and the citizens, wildly excited, could do little but save some personal property, women and children materially assisting in the effort.

Tanager's general merchandise store, loss, \$20,000; insurance, \$10,000.

Two warehouses, both filled with oats, the other empty, both leased by McKinley Mitchell.

The proportion consumed were mostly insured, but to what extent cannot now be ascertained. Among the losses were 175 cords of wood belonging to Jacob Miller. The City Hall is now being used as a temporary postoffice and as a storage room for some of the goods saved.

Loss total, approximately \$50,000.

A true statement of the loss that resulted from the fire cannot be made now, but the total damage will approximate \$50,000, with but little insurance.
