Douglas County Poultry Association's Annual Exhibition.

The third annual exhibit of the Douglas County Poultry Association will be held at Roseburg, Dec. 17, 18, 19, and 20, 1902, in the new Douglas County bank building on Jackson street. Judge L. N. Cabble, of Oakland, Calif., has been selected as judge. Wm. H. Arps, of Santa Cruz, Calif., has written that he intends stopping off at Roseburg to take in the show upon his return from the state show at Portland. B. F. Keeney, of Goshen, Ore., will also be here.

Major Kinney Goes to Coos.

Major L. D. Kinney returned from Portland Sunday, and left today for Coos Bay where he goes to lay off the hands working for the company in that section. Major Kinney says that they have found that it will be impossible to continue the work during the rainy season, as there is being little or no progress whatever made, and that under the greatest difficulty and hardship, therefore he sees fit to discontinue work for the present, but states positively that work on the Great Central will be resumed by April and will then be pushed ahead with all possible dispatch. In regard to the citizens of Roseburg, Major Kinney expressed considerable surprise at the "cold blooded" way that many of our citizens have discouraged eastern Capital.
