## Paying the Deserving.

Henry H. Woodward, the Post of the Umquiza, received his certificate No. 4108, and his voucher for his Indian War Pension, this morning. Mr. Woodward will receive about \$87 back pay, as the certificate shows that the pension was dated June 27, 1862, granting eight dollars per month.

Henry H. Woodward, was a member of Captain Chapman, Company I, Second Oregon Mounted Volunteers and did good service through the war. Now that the ball is fairly rolling in the Indian War pension, it is probable that the old boys will be receiving their pensions and back pay regularly and thus another just cause is being commemorated.
