The east one-half of the southwest one-quarter and the west one-half of the southwest one-quarter and the west one-half of the southeast one-quarter and the west one-half of the southeast one-quarter of section 22, township 72 south, of range 5 west of the Williamette Meridian, containing 160 acros more or less, be quieted and the fee therein be decreed as in the complaint stated, the interest of said defendant, Edd Strong, be decreed to be 30,1297 thereof, and no more, and that the defendant, Mis.
