Many Roseburg people have decided to spend their vacation at Popular North Beach, at the mouth of the Columbia. Leaving Portland (daily except Sunday present to the joint commission. Inand Monday) on the O. R. & N. Co.'s palatial Steamer T. J. Potter-queen of river boats-five hours are consumed in making the trip to Astoria, the scenery including all that is beautiful, and through the great salmon fishing waters of the Lower Columbia. After a short stop at Astoria, the steamer is' off for Ilwaco, on Baker's Bay, where the passengers board the train waiting and are soon off for North Beach, the popular summer resort of the North Pacific coast. During the trip from Ilwaco the first good view of the Pacific is secured, the train running along the ridge of the beach within two hundred yards of the breakers. The beach is twenty-seven miles long, two hundred yards' wide at low tide, and so hard that' carriage wheels scarcely leave a mark. It is an ideal place for driving, riding, wheeling, or walking, and the surf bathing is unsurpassed. The excellent hotels and beauding places provide good accommodations at prices ranging from one dollar to three dollars per day.

The round trip rate from Portland to Astoria is \$2.50; to Ocean Beach points \$4.00, good until October 15th. On Saturdays, during July an August, round trip tickets are sold to beach points at \$2.50, good for return leaving the beach the following Sunday evening

The Alaskan Boundary Dispute. There seems to be a fair prospect that the Alaska-Yukon boundary dis-Roseburg People Will Find This pute will be speedily and permanently settled, and that, too, in accordance with the contention of the United

States. In England and even in Canada the belief is growing that the Dominion government has a poor case to deed, in some influential quarters in London it is predicted unhesitatingly that the commission will find in favor of the United States. The case of the Dominion is conceded by lawyers and public men who have made a study of it to be family weak. A leading London paper's correspondent at Ottawa expresses this view and declares the whole Canadian claim bears every earmark of being an afterthought or ulterior devise. He points out, in cursorily reviewing his countrymen's contention, that it was not until 1887, after gold was known to exist in paying quantities in Alaska, that Canada discovered an error in the boundary line in her favor. "Indeed." this correspondent continues, "we scarcely regarded our case as worth the candle until after the discovery of gold in the Yukon, seven or eight years ago, when, of course, we desired to control the routes running north from the Lynn canal to the Tukon river and Daw-520.77

This and other similar expressions would seem to foreshadow an early sattlement of the boundary contention is a manner satisfactory to the United States and at least just to Canadlans.


