

# A TAINTED BREATH.

WHAT CAUSES IT AND HOW IT SHOULD BE TREATED.

The Trouble is the Result of Decomposition Along the Respiratory Tract, and the Remedial Measures are: First, to Kill the Bacteria; Second, to Kill the Bacteria; Third, to Kill the Bacteria.

Any one afflicted with bad breath, by means of using disinfectant washes or gargles, should try to discover the cause of the bad breath. It is almost ridiculous to keep using disinfectants while the cause of the fever continues to operate.

Notice a bad smell in the back yard, instead of finding out exactly what the cause of the bad smell is, he would simply throw a disinfectant around, or odorizer. In order to stop or disguise the smell. Such a procedure would be silly indeed.

Or, again, the trouble may be caused by enlarged tonsils. These sometimes assume a globular form, with deep crevices and seams which retain mucus. Again, mucus collects behind the uvula, and this mucus is sure to decompose and cause bad breath.

Any portion of the respiratory tract from the throat to the lungs may be the seat of the difficulty. The mucous surface is liable to entangle mucus, which accumulates and decomposes, which forms a very fetid gas.

The fetor of the breath sometimes originates in the lungs and is no doubt the result of a deranged condition of the whole system. The blood, being charged with foul gases and decomposing material, gives off these gases as each respiration.

Undoubtedly onions and many other aromatic substances find their way out of the system through the breath. In this way a bad stomach may taint the breath.
